Submission Preparation Checklist

Please read checklist and make sure that no point in the checklist is missing:

- Click 'make a submission' tab on J Pak Endo Society (JPES) website www.jpes.org.pk
- Click 'register' if you are submitting to JPES for the first time. If you are already registered with JPES then click 'login'.
- Make sure the submission has not been previously published, nor is it before another journal for consideration (or an explanation has been provided in Comments to the Editor).
- The submission file is in OpenOffice, Microsoft Word, or RTF document file format.
- The text is single-spaced; uses a 12-point font; employs italics, rather than underlining (except with URL addresses); and all illustrations, figures, and tables are placed within the text at the appropriate points.
- The text adheres to the stylistic and bibliographic requirements outlined in the Author Guidelines. (Present on journal website. www.jpes.org.pk)
- Where available, URLs for the references have been provided.

Documents to be uploaded for submission:

1. Covering letter
2. Letter of Undertaking (With signatures of all authors)
3. IRB letter/Ethics committee approval
4. Title page (Authors details with email addresses, phone number, degrees and institutional affiliations , Corresponding Author's Name and email address)
5. Manuscript as per guidelines provided on journal website
6. Conflict of interest
7. Funds statement
8. Authors contribution

Manuscript Evaluation Process:

- Submitted manuscripts undergo a thorough review process to assess their originality, significance, reader interest, and composition.
- Manuscripts not submitted in accordance with the provided instructions will be returned to the author for necessary corrections before processing begins. To ensure originality, all manuscripts undergo a similarity check using the Turnitin service. Articles exceeding a similarity threshold of 20% are returned to authors for clarification and/or correction.
- Revised manuscripts are evaluated based on their responsiveness to suggestions and criticisms raised during the initial review. Following this, manuscripts are sent for evaluation by two external peer reviewers and statistical experts.
- Each manuscript undergoes further scrutiny for technical, epidemiological, statistical, ethical, and language accuracy. Accepted manuscripts may undergo editing by the Editorial Office for scientific precision and clarity.
- The Editorial Board of the Journal of the Pakistan Endocrine Society reserves the right to make the final decision on accepting or rejecting any article for publication at all stages of the review process.
